



Mustang Soccer League FAQs

What is the difference between Division 1 and Division 3?

Division 1 is the highest level of competition available for youth soccer players. It involves the most traveling and the highest cost to play. Division 1 is for the most talented players and the ones who are the most committed to the game of soccer, as the Division 1 season is mostly year round. D1 is available between the ages of U8-U20 and is the premier development program for elite youth soccer players. D1 is broken down into subdivisions, further enabling players of different skill levels to be placed in the proper level of competition. Division 1 teams are coached and trained by paid professional coaches.

Division 3 is the second highest level of competition in youth soccer. It does not travel as much as Division 1, but does travel to various tournaments and for league play. D3 is for youth players who are looking for a higher competitive challenge than Recreational soccer, but not the commitment of D1 play. D3 teams are coached by volunteer coaches, and have one of their weekly trainings with a paid trainer.

How do I register for Tryouts?

- Click on your child's age group with the correlating time that you would like to attend tryouts.
- Click register now, and then click continue. (If you remember your login, you can login to complete registration; however, it is not necessary.)
- Fill out the information on the form and click continue to reserve that time slot for your child.
- If you have more than one child signing up for tryouts, follow the same process.

Players do not have to pay registration fees in order to try out. Registration fees are due prior to the close of the registration window (March 31st), or late fees may apply.

Players may try out for D1 teams and, if not placed, may register and tryout for D3 teams afterward.

What does the "U" in the age groups means? What age group is my child in?

The "U" in the age groups means under. When a child is in U10 that means he/she is under the age of 10, essentially 9 for most of the year. There are exceptions for children born in August, September, October, November or December. What is the policy for players who live outside of Danville?

The Out of Area policy varies depending on age and level of play. Please consult the Out of Area Policy below for your child's age group and Division. The Out of Area Policy only pertains to the competitive teams.

What is Gold, Silver and Bronze? What is Red, White and White Plus?

Gold and Silver are historical names for the two main levels of play within the D1 competitive level. Bronze has traditionally been the name for the D3 level, as is the archaic "Red" designation that is no longer used. The Division 4 (recreational) teams are also known as the White division. The White Plus level of play is also recreational, with additional training and playing opportunities.

When is open registration?

Open registration for Mustang Soccer League begins February 1st and runs until March 31st. From April 1st through June 30th, there is Late Registration, which has a late fee associated with it for late-registering players.

Can my child be placed on the same team as their friends?

Children in the competitive (D1 and D3) levels are placed on teams based upon skill, not location or association with other players. In the recreational (D4) level children are placed onto teams via their school zone and code. The amount of volunteer coaches effects the placement of children for their teams, we try to place games and practices as close to home as possible but a lack of coaches doesn't always allow us to do such.

How do I volunteer to be a coach/assistant coach?

When you register your child during the open registration, you can also register yourself as a coach or assistant coach. Having enough volunteers ensures the practices and games to be closer to your school zone and code.
